## GRAMMAR

**The Focus of This Lesson is Expressing Extremes with Adjectives**

最低三折

*zeoi3 dai1 saam1 zit3*

"Seventy percent off at most."

The most common way of expressing extremes is below.

最 + adjective = "the most" + adjective.

最靚係你。

*zeoi3 leng3 hai6 nei5 .*

"The most beautiful one is you."

七月最熱。

*cat1 jyut6 zeoi3 jit6 .*

"July is the hottest."

邊個最好？

*bin1 go3 zeoi3 hou2 ?*

"Which one is the best?"

邊個最好睇？

*bin1 go3 zeoi3 hou2 tai2 ?*

"Which one is the best-looking?"

## Examples from This Lesson

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1. 最低三折  
*zeoi3 dai1 saam1 zit3*  
"Seventy percent off at most"

## Language Tip

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In Cantonese or other Chinese languages, expressing discount is to say what is on as opposed to saying what's off. For example, "twenty percent off" is 八折 ("eighty percent on").
