### **CULTURAL INSIGHT**

### 1. Chinese New Year

Chinese New Year celebrations traditionally ran from Chinese New Year's Eve, the last day of the last month of the Chinese calendar, to the Lantern Festival on the fifteenth day of the first month, making the festival the longest in the Chinese calendar.

### 2. Christmas

Christmas is celebrated as a major festival and public holiday in Hong Kong.

### 3. Dragon Boat Festival

The Dragon boat festival occurs on the fifth day of the fifth month of the Chinese calendar. Its origins relate to the suicide of Qu Yuan in 278 BCE. He was a poet and statesman of the Chu kingdom during the Warring States period.

### 4. Mid-autumn Festival

The Mid-autumn festival is held on the fifteenth day of the eighth month in the Chinese calendar, during a full moon.

# 5. National Day

The National Day of the People's Republic of China is celebrated every year on October 1. Hong Kong started celebrating after the reunification in 1997.
