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INTRODUCTION

Gabriella: Hi everyone, I'm Gabriella.

Olivia: And I'm Olivia!

Gabriella: And welcome to Culture Class: Essential Cantonese Vocabulary, Lesson 18! In this lesson you'll learn five essential words related to people and homes. FIVE KEY VOCABULARY ITEMS

Gabriella: Olivia, what's our first word?

Olivia: 神枱

Gabriella: household shrines

Olivia: (slow) 神枱 (regular) 神枱

Gabriella: Listeners, please repeat:

Olivia: 神枱

[pause - 5 sec.]

Gabriella: Small household shrines are very common among the Chinese and those from Southeast Asia. Usually a small lamp and small offerings are kept by the shrine. Gabriella: Now let's hear a sample sentence using this word.

Olivia: (normal) 臨走記得喺神枱上兩炷香呀。

Gabriella: Remember to burn some incense at the household shrine before leaving. Olivia: (slow) 臨走記得喺神枱上兩炷香呀。

Gabriella: Okay, what's the next word?

Olivia: 麻雀

Gabriella: Mahjong

Olivia: (slow) 麻雀 (regular) 麻雀

Gabriella: Listeners, please repeat:

Olivia: 麻雀

[pause - 5 sec.]

Gabriella: Mahjong is a game that originated in China which is commonly played by four players. Most households in Hong Kong have at least one mahjong set.

Gabriella: Now let's hear a sample sentence using this word.

Olivia: (normal)

隔離屋成日打麻雀, 嘈死人喇! Gabriella: My neighbor plays mahjong everyday. It's so noisy! Olivia: (slow) 隔離屋成日打麻雀, 嘈死人喇! Gabriella: Okay, what's the next word? Olivia: 冷氣機 Gabriella: air conditioner Olivia: (slow) 冷氣機 (regular) 冷氣機 Gabriella: Listeners, please repeat: Olivia: 冷氣機 [pause - 5 sec.] Gabriella: People in Hong Kong love to use their air conditioners, which is contributing to the major air pollution the city has. Gabriella: Now let's hear a sample sentence using this word. Olivia: (normal) 香港咁潮濕, 真係唔開冷氣機唔得。 Gabriella: Hong Kong is so humid, it's inevitable to use an air conditioner. Olivia: (slow) 香港咁潮濕, 真係唔開冷氣機唔得。 Gabriella: Okay, what's the next word? Olivia: 晾衫架 Gabriella: drying racks Olivia: (slow) 晾衫架 (regular) 晾衫架 Gabriella: Listeners, please repeat: Olivia: 晾衫架 [pause - 5 sec.] Gabriella: Not many Hong Kong households own a dryer, so drying racks and outside drying sticks for clothing are very common. Gabriella: Now let's hear a sample sentence using this word. Olivia: (normal) 佢見過晾衫架跌落街, 所以唔敢喺下面行。 Gabriella: He saw a drying rack fall out of the building, so he does not dare walk down there. Olivia: (slow) 佢見過晾衫架跌落街, 所以唔敢喺下面行。 Gabriella: Okay, what's the last word? Olivia: 外傭 Gabriella: foreign domestic helpers Olivia: (slow) 外傭 (regular) 外傭 Gabriella: Listeners, please repeat: Olivia:

[pause - 5 sec.] Gabriella: There are more than 320,000 foreign domestic helpers employed by Hong Kong families, which make up approximately 3 percent of the population. They usually live in their employer's residence and perform various household duties. Gabriella: Now let's hear a sample sentence using this word. Olivia: (normal) 香港大部分外傭都係嚟自菲律賓。

Gabriella: Most of the foreign domestic helpers in Hong Kong are from the Philippines. Olivia: (slow) 香港大部分外傭都係嚟自菲律賓。
