Pronunciation Tip

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When wrapping your mind around Cantonese words and their tones, try to hear the word as a whole rather than attempting to pronounce each syllable in its separate tone. If you listen to an entire word and try to mimic the overall sound of the combined word, the tones will start to come a lot easier. Over-exaggerating each tone syllable by syllable makes it hard to speak naturally.
