### **Grammar Points**

After you have eaten your fill, it is time to grab the bill. To do this, wave the waiter over while loudly saying 唔該埋單. (m4 goi1 maai4 daan1). The word 埋單 literally translates as "to bury the list." This is the same 單 from 菜單 ("menu").

To call the waiter over, say 小姐 (siu2 ze2) if it is a lady, and 先生 (sin1 saang1) if it is a man. Both of these names are proper. If you are in a bar, the names change to 靚仔 (leng3 zai2) and 靚女 (leng3 neoi5), respectively.

## Cultural Insight

#### Quick Tip

When paying the bill, you don't want to be shy when calling to the waitress. Simply wave your hand, and with a loud clear voice, proclaim 埋單! (maai4 daan1). If you mispronounce the word, you may be skipped over, so spend time practicing it in loud, noisy restaurants.

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
