#### Quick Tip

In English, before someone takes a picture, the person taking the picture may say, "1, 2, 3, cheese." In Cantonese, you might hear "cheese" here and there, and counting 1,2,3 in Cantonese is, jat ji saam, jat ji saam.

This literally means, "one, two three, one, two, three." Let's try it next time you have someone take your picture!
