
Zero Conditional

Hello and welcome back, in this lesson we will be exploring the zero conditional.



What is it?



Firstly we need to know that a zero conditional sentence is made up of two halves:

If + Present Simple Then Present Simple



We use the zero conditional to describe what always happens as a result of something. Such as scientific rules which are, by definition, unchanging and where the results always happen the same.



Examples:

Take ice out of the fridge in summer, it melts.



An apple will rot, if you leave it out.



How else?



We can also use the zero conditional to say what we do as a rule in certain situations. Here, we are not talking about what we do in a particular, specific situation but what we always do in these conditions.

If I get a headache, I take a pill.



If I am late, I get a taxi to work.
